
Here's a quick look at our classified staff and their roles:

- Mrs. Wild and Mrs. Person team together to run the front office. Each day they take on a wide variety of tasks, from registering new students to answering parent and staff inquiries.
- Mrs. Janssen takes care of the health needs for our students. Also, she is amazingly connected to resources in our community and helps students and their families get the resources they need.
- Mrs. Carey, Mrs. Clogston, Mrs. Fukuda, Mrs. Nachmanson, Mrs. Stokes and Mrs. Klein work in our Special Services classroom at Arrowhead. This team works to support our students with specially designed instruction for students within the program along with our Learning Center which supports students with an Individual Education Plan or who qualify for additional support in reading or math.
- Mrs. Morford and Mrs. Bragg serve as school assistants. They brave the cold and wet elements each day to supervise our students at the crosswalk and on the playground. They also help in classrooms in a variety of ways and prepare materials for staff members.
- Mrs. Smith is our technology specialist and school assistant. In addition to helping in classrooms and
 playground, she runs the computer lab for our students and assists staff and students with a variety of
 technology needs.
- Mr. Strom and Mr. Tran make up our custodial and facilities team. Mr. Strom opens the building each morning at 6:30 AM and works until mid-day. Mr. Tran works from afternoon until 10:00 PM when he closes and secures the building. They make sure our school is clean, stocked with supplies and well maintained.
- Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Pugsley provide breakfast and lunch for our students each day. They prepare food, wash lunch trays and make sure lunch money balances are up to date.
- Mrs. Gonzalez is here to support English Language Learners (ELL) throughout the day. She also helps assess all ELL students each year.
- Mrs. Laibson is our school therapist. We are fortunate to have her at school two days a week. She meets with students one on one, in small group sessions and for social skills classes.

Arrowhead's Getting School Ready Events

At Arrowhead, we want to make sure that all of our incoming kindergarteners are "school ready" and excited about becoming Arrowhead Hawks! One of the ways we support our incoming kindergarteners and their families is to hold school events in the spring where families can meet some staff and participate in reading or math activities. In order to ensure that all incoming kindergarten families are invited to Arrowhead's **Getting School Ready Events**, we are asking that you notify us if you have an incoming kindergartener. In addition, if you know any incoming kindergarten families, please pass on the information to them. The Arrowhead School Ready Team is dedicated to supporting school readiness and the successful transition into kindergarten! Please call the Arrowhead office to RSVP at 425-408-4000. Attendance and Absence Reporting

At Arrowhead we review attendance on a weekly basis and as required by Washington State law, follow up on all unexcused absences and chronic tardiness. It is very important to have your child to school on time and in attendance for the entire day. Appointments should be made for before or after school.

While we know that parents make every effort to try not to schedule appointments that require students to be pulled out of school early, we have noticed a trend where parents are picking up their children early at the end of the day. The last few minutes of the school day are critical for giving out important information, homework and for proper cleaning and packing up. Having this time disrupted is hard on both the students and the teacher as focus is pulled away from the task at hand each time a student leaves. When the need arises to pull a student out early, it is important to send a written note to school with the student so that both the teacher and office staff are aware and can be prepared for the student leaving early.

The office requests your assistance in reporting absences. Parents frequently let teachers know of upcoming absences however it is the responsibility of the school secretary to follow up on students who have not been excused from school. Please do not email your teacher with regard to an absence, late arrival or change in after school plans. Classroom teachers welcome your communication when your student has a change of attendance plan but those emails don't always come to the office before attendance is completed in the morning.

There are several ways to report an absence:

- For pre-planned absences of more than two days, we request parents fill out our pre-approved absence request form, prior to leaving. This for can be found on the Arrowhead website under the "Parent" tab under "Attendance" or here:
 www.nsd.org/Page/32032. Please send the form to school with your student this will guarantee that everyone at school is aware of the absence and your student's attendance updated appropriately.
- 2. For short term (two days or less) or day of absence or late arrivals there are two ways to report your student's status:
 - You may call the school office (425) 408-4000. There is a 24-hour voicemail line where you can leave you're the information about the absence or late arrival.
 - Online absence reporting under the "Parents/Attendance" area in the Arrowhead website, there is an online form
 where you can report your student's absence or late arrival. You can go here to take a look:
 <u>www.nsd.org/domain/2125</u> The information you provide in the form comes directly to the office and will be used to
 record attendance for your student.

If you have any questions about attendance, absences or any of the tools available for reporting this information please call the school office and we would be happy to help.

Parking/Safety Information

Parking at Arrowhead is at a premium and we know that it can be daunting to get in and out of the campus. We have seen a rise in parking across Arrowhead Drive in between the "No Parking" signs that are posted. The tight curve in that area makes it a very dangerous place to park as there is no view of oncoming traffic when backing out. The Kenmore Police have and will continue to patrol after school and will ticket cars that are parked between those signs. Thank you for your help keeping our neighbors and students safe.

Recently we have instituted a new procedure for parking and signing in to visit the school. ALL VISITORS to campus are required to sign in at the office. Staff has been instructed to stop and request anyone not wearing a visitor sticker/badge return to the office. We ask that you please also provide your car make/model/color and license plate information. We appreciate that our community follows this procedure.

<u>Parking Lot</u> - For safety and security reasons, there is no public parking at school during school hours. The parking lot is for staff and Arrowhead visitors only.

Registration: Online starting March 6th

Sign up is through Touchbase on the NSD website; https://schoolsales.nsd.org or from our Arrowhead website. You may also use the paper registration form found on the link. If you choose the paper form, you can send the form, along with the payment to school with your student. The registration fee is \$35 or \$17.50 for free & reduced qualifying families. For online payments you will need your Touchbase logon information to register. If you don't have your logon information please call the Arrowhead Office, (425) 408-4000.

The Team: Boys and girls in grades 3-5 may join Arrowhead's Track team and be a part of a wonderful track season this spring. The goal is to introduce students to track and field events while providing individual instruction to develop their skills. Teamwork, sportsmanship and leadership are always emphasized.

Practices: Begin on Tuesday, April 3rd and will be held on the track <u>during lunch recesses</u> on <u>Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays.</u> Please come check in at the gym with coach at the beginning of each practice. Students are required to attend **9** full practices in order to compete in a track meet.

Meets: are held on <u>Tuesdays</u> at 4:45pm and run until about 6:15pm. In order for a prompt meet start time, students are encouraged to be picked up right when school dismisses and taken directly to the meet site. Students may "check out" and leave the meet when they have finished their last event

Transportation: Arrangements are the responsibility of the student and their parent. On meet days please plan on **signing out** your student and leaving when the school bell rings. The table with the sign out sheets will be in front of the office.

Home Meet: Arrowhead will be hosting on May 8th at <u>Northshore Middle School</u>. We are always in need of parent volunteers. Please email Ms. Miller or use Signup Genius (coming soon to the Arrowhead website!) if you would like to help out at our home meet and/or at the <u>Junior Olympics meet on Wednesday, May 22nd</u> at Bothell High School.

Uniforms: Each student will be issued a team jersey for use during the season. Please wash and return them at the conclusion of the season. Students are responsible for providing their own shorts and shoes. (Cleats & spikes are not allowed.)

Social Media Reminder

Volunteers are restricted from taking images (photos and videos) for personal use of students at school, school sponsored events or on field trips. Student images may not be posted on Facebook, using other social media, sent via email or distributed using other communication channels. If a volunteer is taking images for school-related use, appropriate district and school procedures must be followed. Birthday Policy

To avoid hurt feelings, students may only deliver birthday invitations at school if they are inviting every student in their class. Students are responsible for checking with their teacher to determine the appropriate time and manner to distribute the invitations. Often, parents request that they be permitted to celebrate their child's birthday at school. Sharing this special day with other classmates at school is great; however, we ask that you follow this simple guideline: due to food safety issues and various food allergies, birthday celebrations at school **may not include** food items. Please check with your child's teacher about appropriate alternatives.

Dress Code

We need your continued help in making sure that our students make good choices regarding proper school attire. Some of the current fashions are not fitting in an elementary school setting. Shoulder straps on shirts must be at least two fingers wide. Shirt necklines must be above the armpits. Shorts or skirts need to be a minimum length of mid-thigh. Also, flip-flops are a safety hazard in PE and on the playground. Students wearing inappropriate clothing will be sent to the nurse for more suitable clothing. Please consider this as you help your child make choices for school clothing.

Pet Policy

Dogs and other pets are wonderful in your home environment. During school hours they can be a distraction and a safety issue. If you wish to walk your student to or from school with a dog, please arrange a meeting/departure location **off** campus. In addition, please discuss with your student's teacher before bringing the family pet for show and tell. The school is required to get advance permission from all students before animals can be brought into the classroom. Many animals are not appropriate for the school environment. We have several trained therapy dogs working on campus as well as guide dogs in training. Please respect the trainers and dogs by asking permission before touching. In many cases, the trainer could be using the situation to reinforce appropriate behavior and interaction with people will be discouraged.

Parking Lot & Student Safety

There is no adult supervision prior to **9:10am** - unsupervised students are not allowed on campus until that time. Thank you for modeling safe and appropriate behavior at all times in the parking lot and using the designated crosswalks. Students should be accompanied by an adult when walking in the parking lot to or from a parked car. Cars are not allowed in the bus circle between the hours of 8:00am and 5:00pm. After school hours are especially important to keep the bus circle clear due to the activity buses that drop off from the junior high and high school. Please observe the strict 5 MPH speed limit and follow directions given to you by staff, volunteers and safety patrol.

Vacations & Homework Requests

As a general rule, teachers do no provide students with schoolwork when families take vacations outside of the district's scheduled school breaks. The work students do in the classroom, along with the instruction needed for them to adequately understand how to complete it, cannot be replicated outside of school. If you choose to take your child(ren) out of school while it is in session, be aware that they may miss critical learning.



Placement Process for the 2018-2019 School Year



In May, teachers from each grade level meet to begin to form tentative class groupings for the following school year. As they form the groups, teachers take numerous factors into consideration including: boy/girl ratios, academic performance/needs, social mix/compatibility, behavior patterns, learning styles, special needs, total number of students per class and parent and teacher input. This list of "placement criteria" is not exhaustive.

After the tentative class lists are made, teachers, specialists, and the principal review the lists to balance academic and social dynamics. Pertinent parental input is also considered. A balanced group is critical in ensuring the best learning environment for our students.

Throughout the summer, many students will enroll and others may move. We invariably make many final adjustments prior to school beginning. At that time, teachers are assigned to the class lists. Class placement will be mailed approximately one week before school starts, so please look for Back to School Open House and Curriculum Night information in the mail in late summer.

While we believe classroom teachers know an incredible amount of information about your child's needs at school, we also realize parents have an understanding of unique needs and qualities that sometimes go beyond our knowledge. We'll combine any exceptional input about your child's needs with the information we have gathered and know about your child at school. Parent survey forms will be sent home with students on Tuesday, May 1st and are due back to school by Friday, May 11th.

Please keep the following in mind:

- 1) Student behaviors and needs at school are often different from those demonstrated at home.
- 2) As "Public Educators", we are responsible for ensuring that each child, regardless of race, gender, academic talent, special needs, background, economic status, parental support or behavioral pattern, has an equal educational opportunity.
- 3) For an optimal class configuration, some students need to be separated from others.
- 4) Classroom groupings, based directly on parent requests, can result in poor group dynamics, student needs which are not well balanced among all the groups, classes organized by cliques, sports teams, neighborhoods, etc. that can have a negative impact on the mission and social development of the whole school.
- 5) Elementary school is a seven-year experience during which students learn a great many skills that we do not teach from textbooks. A critical life-skill for children is to learn that the diversity of people they will meet is an enriching and exciting part of life. Children also learn that they are capable of coping with a variety of situations especially when open and positive about the possibilities.

Classroom assignments are made after carefully thinking through the variables relating to your child/children. While requests for specific teachers will not be considered, specific educational and behavioral concerns you have regarding your child's needs will certainly be taken into account when balancing the class. When the names of particular teachers are given, the information is blacked out. Please rest assured we will make careful placement decisions for all Arrowhead students.

Notes from the Nurse

Spring is a time of longer days but still very wet weather. Please be sure to send your student dressed appropriately for the weather. There are still many cool, wet days ahead. Also, cold, flu and other viruses often hit hard in the spring. Covering coughs and hand washing with soap and water is still the best defense against spreading the viruses, whether respiratory, stomach bugs, pink eye or other. Teaching your child to scrub their hands with soap while singing the "Happy Birthday" or "A-B-C" song is a good reminder of how long to leave the soap on while scrubbing. Many young children only wet their hands and immediately wash off the soap before scrubbing their hands. We appreciate you reinforcing habits we are teaching at school regarding hand washing!

Just as a reminder, please do not send any medication or over the counter products (including allergy relief, cough drops, etc.) to school with your student or in their backpacks. Please call Nurse Anne if your student requires anything at school even if just for short term use.

Also, please be sure to update the nurse with any changes in your students' health information or medications.

The health room is short of girls and boys pants in sizes 8-10. Leggings or athletic type pants with elastic waists work best and fit most students. If you are spring cleaning and have any donations, we'll gladly accept some! We also take donations of basketball type shorts (boys and girls) all year long. Thank you!
