

# From the Principal

Dear Families and Community,

November is recognized as <u>Native American Month</u>. I'm frequently reminded that until accurate and complete historical information is the norm, we need to be intentional about focusing on people, histories and issues that have been marginalized. As well, since Thanksgiving is celebrated in November, we continue to grapple with how to correct the history and keep the celebration. Eating together and practicing gratitude are positive human experiences across cultures, but the traditional stories around the first Thanksgiving are not accurate. We deserve to know the truth.

For example, we just received a wonderful little booklet from the Bothell Historical Society that highlights the history of Bothell---starting with the first white settler. I wish the history started earlier with the tribes who were here, who traveled along the river from what is now Issaquah to what is now Kenmore. Our new reading curriculum includes units on homesteaders, Oregon Trail migrants and even the Grand Canyon, but all of them start the story with white contact with the land. The whole history of things is worth knowing.



The little boy to the far right in this photo is my great-grandfather. Thornton, New Mexico no longer exists, and neither do my great-grandfather's home or his uncle's store. The Anglo town has disappeared along with the Anglo name, and this land is now the Santo Domingo Pueblo outside of Albuquerque, New Mexico, inhabited by the Kewa Nation.

I don't know how my ancestors treated their Kewa neighbors, but it probably wasn't as equals. That's unfortunate, because if my great-grandfather had spent more time playing with the Kewa children in this photo he probably would have had a better sense of humor.

It's time for public education to incorporate the history and existence of the tribal people in our region. We can learn a lot from this history. Native history is really an example of community, survival, resilience, and invention. As a species, a nation, and a society we need to be better at all four of those things. Do a quick internet search and you will find valuable, interesting (and accurate!) information about our neighbors and predecessors, the Coast Salish, and the environmental, social and political history of our region.

Watch <u>this</u> for some historical (1920s) footage of the daily life of Coast Salish people. <u>This video</u> is a great overview of Native Peoples of the Pacific Northwest that starts in the ice age and has some lovely photographs and information. <u>This video</u> is longer, includes some recent political events, and is a good one for adults.

At Arrowhead we're hoping to change the trajectory of how history has been taught. We want Arrowhead students to learn a complete, accurate history of our region and nation. This week our first graders visited the Hibulb Cultural Center, where they learned about the culture, history and beliefs of the Tulalip Tribal people. Did you know the Tulalip Tribes are made up of the Skykomish, Snoqualmie, Snohomish and many other tribes and groups who signed the <a href="Irreaty of Point Elliot">Irreaty of Point Elliot</a>? Because tribes were not conquered in war but entered into peace treaties where they traded land for certain rights, tribal history isn't about conqueror and conquered – it's about strategy and survival. Stories and examples of community, resilience and problem solving such as the Coast Salish provide are invaluable as our children learn to take care of each other and our planet.

## Is it a Cold? or COVID?... It doesn't matter! Please stay home!

# **Technology Update**

## **How to Clean my Chromebook**

- Shut down the device and unplug all external power sources and cables.
- Use microfiber cloths with an ammonia-free cleaner such as Windex Multi-Surface Vinegar.
- Spray the cleaner on the cloth and use the lightly dampened cloth to clean the surface.
- Ensure surfaces have completely air-dried before powering on the device or closing and storing it.

## **How to Disinfect my Chromebook**

- Shut down the device and unplug all external power sources and cables.
- Use only <u>70-75% alcohol wipes to</u> gently and carefully wipe the entire surface of the device. This includes the display/screen, keyboard, trackpad/mouse, and exterior surface of the item.
- Ensure surfaces have completely air-dried before powering on the device or closing and storing it.

**DO NOT** use aerosol sprays, bleach, peroxide-based, ammonia-based, or abrasive cleaners. Avoid excessive wiping or submerging the item in cleanser to avoid damage. **Never spray cleaners/liquids directly onto computer keyboards or screens.**
